HISTORY OF THE ASSOCIATION

1996: The Alzheimer's Disease Programme started as a Project of the President of the Soroptimist International Club of Port of Spain with a seminar on "Alzheimer's Disease, the Affected Person and The Caregiver".

Support groups for caregivers were formed. These persons became the core of the Alzheimer's Association of Trinidad and Tobago (AZATT)

2000: AZATT registered as a Non-Profit Organization. AZATT admitted as a provisional member of Alzheimer's Disease International (ADI), the International Federation of Alzheimer Associations.

2003: Partnership with Alzheimer Society of Canada (ASC)

2004: AZATT was admitted officially to ADI as a full member.

2005: President Norma Inniss was elected to the ADI Board for the period 2005-2009

2006: ASC and AZATT formally twinned through an ADI Twinning initiative.

2008: the Twin Presidents - Debbie Benczkowski (ASC) and Norma Inniss (AZATT) gave a presentation at the First World Summit and Symposium on Eldercare Mediation in Canada.

2009: Norma Inniss elected to ADI board for a second three year term

2011: Poster Presentation at ADI Conference, Canada on " A study of Attitudes Towards Alzheimer's Disease and other Dementias in Trinidad and Tobago." - Joyanne de Four Babb and Joan Rawlins

2012: Launch of Arima Support Group

2013: President Norma Inniss represented AzATT at the Canada - Caribbean Partnership Meeting in Barbados in May. (Other Caribbean countries represented were Barbados, Jamaica, Dominica, St. Kitts)

President Norma Inniss attended ADI Regional Workshop in St. Maarten in August. culminating in formation and membership on Caribbean Dementia Newsletter Committee with first publication of Caribbean Dementia Newsletter. November-December 2013.
